WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN GEMSTONES


Bill Dewey will be speaking at the Thursday, February 4th meeting. He will be talking on Gemstones and their history. He will show us how to tell the difference between natural and lab created gemstones and what to look for in gemstones.

Bill Dewey is one of the founders of the Central Brevard Rock and Gem Club and serves on the Board. He has served as president and show chairman at our club and the Melbourne club. He has taught silver casting and cabochons, but currently teaches faceting on Wednesday mornings and plans on teaching on Gem Identification.

Bill served in the U. S. Army for four years as a Weapons Testing Specialist and was a reservist for two years. For 34 years, Bill worked at Patrick AFB managing the visiting aircraft of VIPs and astronauts.

He has a M.S. from the Geologic Institute of America and a graduate gem cutter degree. He has worked in archaeology, gemology, and Anthropology and he is one of us.

Club Purpose:


The purpose of this club is to foster interest in and to promote knowledge and appreciation of minerals, gems, fossils, and the earth sciences.

Central Brevard Rock and Gem Club General Meeting January 7, 2021 Merritt Island Library

Attendees: 19

Meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance at 6:10pm.

Mario offered a greeting to all membership asking for continued participation allowing club to move forward despite current situation dealing with the COVID-19 virus as best as we can.

Minutes of last meeting waived due to holiday dinner, where members present voted to suspend actual meeting. Elections did take place with Mario as president, Elizabeth as 1st VP, Lucy as 2nd VP, Roz as secretary, Michele as Treasurer. Board members are now Sara, Dick, John, and Billy.

Membership report given by Michele due to Lucy's absence. We have 68 members at end of 2020, with 15 renewals for 2021.

Treasurer's report given by Michele. We did well in December mostly due to vendor monies for the show. Annual expenses continue to be greater than our income due to low attendance at the workshop and limited classes. Members are reminded that dues (\$30) are due by the end of January. With membership card, admission to the show is free.

Budget: Darlene presented current budget to members. She stated that it was a difficult task to do, since it could not be balanced. Due to our current situation with COVID-19, it is very difficult to plan ahead. So, we are being very frugal with our expenditures and hope the show does well.

Workshop report given by Michele and John. Workshop maintenance performed during Xmas week when workshop was closed. All genies, saws, buffer, furnace, A/C were serviced. John recommended that all supervisors continue to monitor use of saws, especially 18" saw.

Classes: Silver casting, beginner and advanced silver classes, kumihimo, chainmaille, opal cutting and wire wrapping continue to be offered. One on one instruction can be arranged for any class except casting by speaking to instructors.

Show report given by Roz. Most vendor tables were sold, food truck will be Don's Barbecue from MI. It was discussed that besides, coffee and tea, prepackaged muffins, cheese, crackers, and some fruit will be available to the vendors and volunteers Saturday and Sunday mornings of the show. We continue to need more volunteers both days of the show. Michele is the contact person for this. We will have 9 new vendors this year.

Newsletters have been going out by email and regular mail. Elizabeth asked for members to email her photos or articles that might be interesting to share.

Facebook: Roz will be monitoring our Facebook page. A boost was sent out to advertise our reach to more potential visitors.

Following the meeting, members participated in silent auction.

We resumed with Michele's photo presentation of her trip to Tucson last year. There were wonderful photos of many rocks and specimens.
