

# THE ROAD TO TUCSON

On Saturday, after volunteering and shopping at our own wonderful hometown show, I rushed off to finish packing and preparing for our first trip to Tucson, Arizona. Tucson has dozens of rock shows running in January and February. This year the last shows were ending on February 13th so we had to hurry before they were over! Bright and early Sunday morning my husband, daughter, and I drove off in our motorhome (which was towing my car on a trailer). The trip went as expected until we pulled into a rest area just past San Antonio, Texas. Suddenly, there was loud grinding, beeping, and then smoke pouring out from under the hood of the motorhome. I rushed around grabbing essential items,

preparing to 'abandon ship' with my daughter before the whole thing burst into flames! Meanwhile, my husband opened the hood and determined we just had a power steering hose blow out. After field repairs failed, we proceeded to try to find a towing service that could tow a 34-foot motorhome with a car sized trailer attached (car now removed). Many calls and several hours later we found a towing service and a repair shop that could make a new hose for us. After a half-day setback, we continued







on our way.

We made it to a small town outside of Tucson on Wednesday and decided to stay there for the duration of our visit since all accommodations in Tucson were booked up due to the rock and gem shows.

The first show we attended was the Tucson Gem and Mineral Club show on Thursday. This show is the original and longest running Tucson show. It's been running since 1955. It was large and full of beautiful things to see! This show seemed to be about half full of museum type (meaning gorgeous and crazy expensive) display specimens but there were plenty of more affordable items to purchase as well. I was ecstatic to be at my first Tucson rock show!

On Friday and Saturday, we went to a number of the hotel shows along the I-10 frontage road in Tucson. The prices here were generally better and the variety of dealers was huge! Many of the dealers were from South America and other areas outside of the United States. We saw everything from giant sized geodes and quartz crystals to faceted gems, jewelry, cabochons, beads, and everything in-between. The number of dealers and the tons (literally) of material they brought with them was astonishing! I found some great deals on some must-have display specimens. Unfortunately, parking wasn't very close so my husband got some exercise hauling my heavy purchases back to the car. A wagon or cart of some sort would have been very helpful. We only brought a backpack which wasn't much help with the large specimens or the 30 pounds of rough agate I just had to buy.

On Sunday (the last day of all the Tucson shows), we went to the miner's co-op show on the north side of Tucson. This show had a lot of slabs (something I didn't see much of at the other shows), rough rock, and also some display specimens and jewelry. The dealers here seemed to be from all regions of the United States. I found

some great slabs and some interesting, new (to me) rough rock. Our very last stop was the Kino Show which we attended on Sunday afternoon. Here I finally scored one of the last items on my wish list: a large (30 inch high) amethyst cathedral geode. Unfortunately, we didn't get to see much of this show. It was getting late, dealers were packing up, and we were exhausted. (continued on next page)


### ROAD TO TUCSON (continued)

It was lucky for my family that we arrived near the end of the shows. Otherwise, they may never have gotten me to leave. I am already dreaming of the next time I can get to Tucson...
