**COLD CONNECTIONS APRIL 12TH AT THE SHOP.** John Catana taught a Cold Connections class to four CBRGC members. We worked with sheet copper to create peapod bracelets, earrings, and leaves. We cut, stamped, and shaped copper. It was a really fun class and everyone created at least two pieces.


